6th -West Salem Garden Club. Come for Green Street U.M.C. fellowship dinner, Meeting starts at 7 pm.

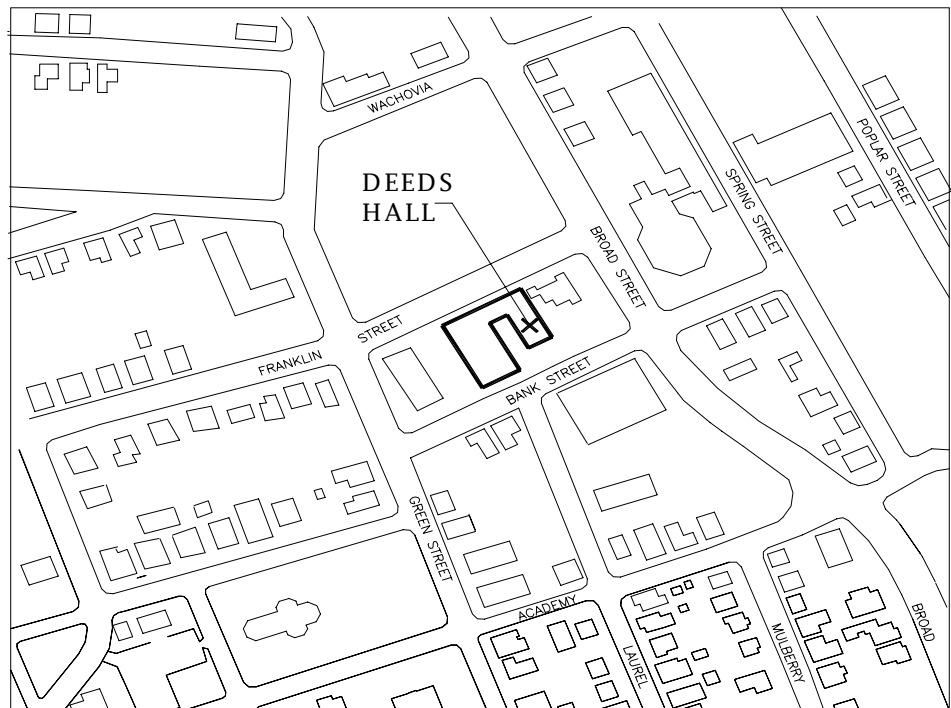
